The Lewy Body Dementia Association (LBDA) compiles and creates LBD-related videos to better educate and support the LBD community. Part of this effort includes the creation of the 2023 Community Webinar Series. This series showcases experts who discuss topics like vision changes in LBD, using palliative/comfort care, research priorities of those living with LBD and their carepartners, and how to cope with cognitive challenges. The Lewy Briefs series are summarized educational videos lasting a few minutes.

The most recent Community Webinar video, "You Spoke, We Listened," presented a summary of results from an online survey the LBDA shared with people living with LBD, current carepartners and former carepartners. The survey spearheaded by the University of Florida asked questions about what they felt were the most important things to research. The speakers shared the top three priorities across all respondents were finding a cure, improving diagnostic testing and figuring out underlying causes. When asked about the impact of LBD symptoms, cognitive changes, cognitive fluctuations and daytime sleepiness/fatigue were ranked as the most bothersome.
