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### Florida's "Protect Our Loved Ones" Act

The Florida Senate passed House Bill No. 1275 in 2023 allowing local law enforcement to develop and maintain a database of people in their community who have various disabilities (link to Bill: <a href="https://www.flsenate.gov/Committees/billsummaries/2023/html/3044#:~:text=The%20bill%2C%20known%20">https://www.flsenate.gov/Committees/billsummaries/2023/html/3044#:~:text=The%20bill%2C%20known%20</a> as%20the,but%20not%20limited%20to%2C%20autism). The Bill went into effect January 1, 2024. Any adult experiencing developmental, psychological or other disability that may impact their interaction with law enforcement can enroll. A legal guardian can also enroll their loved one in the registry. When enrolling, a certification of disability may be required in addition to a birth certificate and power of attorney documentation, if applicable. A letter from your licensed physician, physician assistant or advanced practice registered nurse could work as disability certification.

A look into the future: We previously shared the resources available to Sumer County residents where this type of registry is already available through Sumter County Sherriff Department's Safe Program. The application asks questions that would provide them with helpful information to hopefully improve interactions with registered persons. Each registered person would have a file with what they are sensitive to, how to calm them down, likes/dislikes and specific instructions or information that would be helpful in these interactions.

With the Bill now in effect, we hope to see more programs like this being implemented across the state. Our team at the Fixel Institute will continue to monitor developments in this space and will share any information through this newsletter.
